

Tips for survival in a Bushfire – CATASTROPHIC FIRE DANGER RATING



What does CATASTROPHIC mean?

These are the worst conditions for a bush or grass fire.

Homes are not designed or constructed to withstand fires in these conditions. The safest place to be is away from high risk bushfire areas.

What should I do?

Leaving high risk bushfire areas the night before or early in the day is your safest option – DO NOT WAIT AND SEE.

Avoid forested areas, thick bush or long, dry grass.

Know your triggers – make decisions about:

- ❖ When you will leave?
- ❖ Where will you go?
- ❖ How will you get there?
- ❖ When will you return?
- ❖ What will you do if you cannot leave?
