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Conditions of Ownership:

- All cats six months and over must be registered. Wagin Shire Council requests that cat owners inform Council immediately of any change of ownership, the death of a cat, or a change in address.
 Failure to register a cat may result in a \$5000 penalty under the Cat Act 2011.
- 2. The maximum number of cats over the age of six months that can be kept on any premises is two. Exemptions can be given after a formal request to the Wagin Shire Council has been made.
- 3. All cats must be sterilised (unless exempt or an approved breeder) and microchipped (unless exempt)
- 4. To be exempt from sterilising or microchipping a written exemption from a veterinarian stating that the sterilisation or microchipping will adversely affect the health of the cat must be presented at the time of registration.
- 5. To become an approved cat breeder you must obtain planning approval prior to registering the cat. At the time of registration you must provide a completed "Application of the Grant or Renewal of Approval to Breed Cats" as well as your current membership details of one of the following organisations
 - Cat Owners Association of Western Australia (COAWA)
 - Feline Control Council of Western Australia (FCCWA)
 - Australian National Cats Inc. (ANCATS)
